Tomba Brion — is a site-specific contemporary dance. The tomb of Giuseppe Brion is a synthesis of the physical and symbolic — drawing inspiration from Japanese simplicity and an ancient Islamic cemetery. It is a modernist labyrinth in concrete. Carlo Scarpa’s architecture is movement frozen in time. Choreographer/dancer Siro Guglielmi explores this mediation on life and death — bringing his poetic imagination, capturing the spirit of the place.
